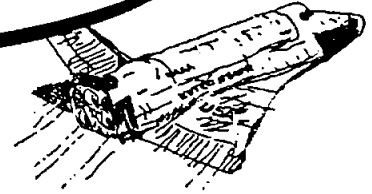

MSC-RCC Minutes for December 1989

On December 14, 1989 at 7:40 pm, the MSC-RCC monthly meeting was called to order by former club president Jim Brock. Jim then announced the club officers for 1990 and the meeting was continued by the new club president Mike Goza.

Old Business: No old business was discussed.

New Business: A motion was made and passed to exclude the formality of having motions seconded before being voted on. All motions will now be proposed, discussed, and then voted on.

Jim Brock announced that he had fuel for sale.

The issue of helicopter student pilots was addressed. It was decided that a helicopter student pilot must maintain an altitude of less than 6-8 feet and must fly 30-50 feet outside the helicopter circle away from the pits. The student must also have a club pilot as a spotter if no helicopter pilot is available.

Dave Thomasson announced that the sanction for the MSC-RCC/Prop-Nuts Joint Scale contest was in for the weekend of May 12-13th at the Prop-Nuts field.

Appreciation was expressed to the old officers and Joe Kastetter for their services in 1989.

The AMA Fly In will be held at Scobee Field on June 1, 2, & 3, 1990.

Charlie Stevens expressed thanks to the MSC-RCC for the money donated to repair the Prop-Nuts field.

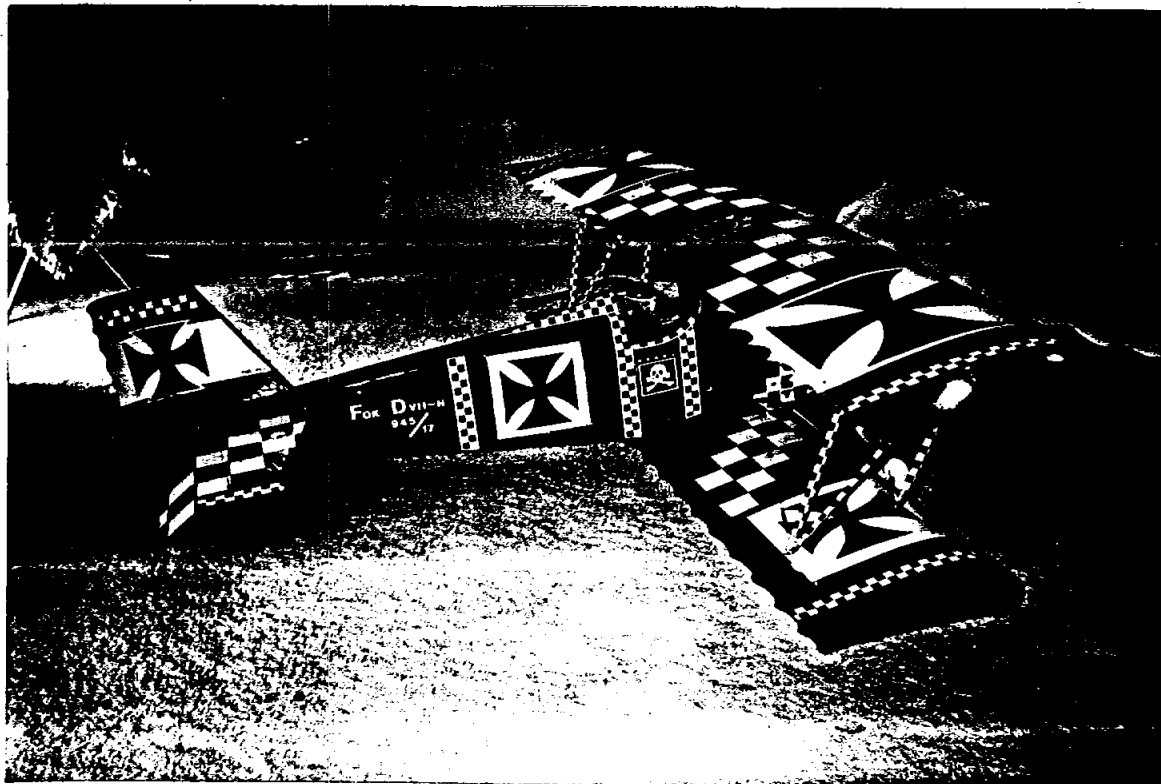
