MINUTES OF MSC/RCC MEETING Thursday March 9, 1988

The meeting was opened by president Brock at 7:40 pm.
Minutes of the last meeting were approved as published in the R/C Flyer. Treasurer Hoffman read the Treasurer's Report.

Four visitors were welcomed and introduced, with invitations to join the Club. Three club members displayed their projects that were underway. David Fenner showed a nearly complete Super 230, Ivan Bonebrake showed a nearly complete quarterscale Fairchild 26, and Jim Brock showed a barely begun Sig Kougar.

There were two entries for Model of the Month: David Shupat showed a recently completed Big Stick decorated in livid red with German WWI Maltese crosses on a white background and Mike Goza showed a new Schluter Longrange helicopter painted in metallic green with trim. Mike Goza won the Model of the Month award in a close vote.

Mike Goza presented the program for the evening; all about helicopters. He brought two working models and the specialized radio equipment that is required.

Old Business: A motion to approve the SAM contest for June 24 in conjunction with the SAM 82 group was approved. The field will be closed on that date to all except the contestants, but Dave Thomasson confirmed that MSC/RCC members are invited to fly on that date at the Prop-Nuts field in Highlands.

Dave Thomasson reviewed the testing of frequencies reported in the R/C Flyer, noting that the data presented in the newsletter were incomplete. A complete version of his report will be distributed with the April newsletter.

Dave Thomasson called for volunteers for the Joint Scale Contest in May.

New Business: Two suggestions were made for further thought. First, it was suggested that the remaining Red Max club fuel be sold at a discount to encourage its use before the Ritchie's Brew is made available. Second, it was suggested that we may wish to start our meetings at 7:00 pm in order to avoid the rush to meet the 10:00 pm curfew. President Brock said he would check with the Park people to see if it is feasible; no change would be made without a vote of the membership.

A motion was made and approved to hold the annual sailplane contest at the field on October 21, 1989.

Dave Thomasson raised the question of a formal training program for beginners, similar to one he has created for the Prop-Nuts club. An outline will be prepared for distribution with the next R/C Flyer.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:30 pm.



# 1989 SAM 82 CONTEST

You may remember that in the last newaletter it was announced that plans for a 2-day contest in October of this year were scuttled when it was learned that the SAM Nationals were moved back to October because of a chance in site location. Usually, SAM Nats are held in July and present no problem with an October date. This time we had a direct conflict and it was decided to postpone any plans for a 2-day contest, deferring instead to the standard one day event. The 1989 SAM 82 contest will be held on June 24th at the MSCRC Club (Manned Space Center Radio Control Club) located at the NASA facilities in Clear Lake, Texas. The MSCRC Club has very generously made their field available to SAM 82 on the 24th of June.

# OLD-TIMER:

All classes combined (A,B,C), ignition and glow combined. SAM rules followed, i.e. 7 minute max with length of engine run from SAM rules for glow and ignition.

#### ANTIQUE:

One class of antique with engine run determined by respective SAM rules, i.e. ignition and glow fuel supply determined by weight of the model. 10 minute max per SAM rules.

#### 1/2A TEXACO:

SAM rules, 15 minute max. (note: this class retains the 8 oz. wing loading, but all other classes are subject to the 10 oz. rule)

# ELECTRIC OLD-TIMER:

Old-timer design, electric powered. Limited motor run; 7 minute maz; time of motor run and any other special rules to be announced later.

Tenative starting time is 9 AM and trophies will be awarded through 3rd place in each event.
