By-Law Amendment








ing Field Pit, Take-off, and Landing Areas



By-Law Amendment (Write-In Ballot)

The main purpose of this "correspondence" is to provide each member of the MSC RCC with a write-in ballot (see below) so that their vote on the proposed amendments to the MSC RCC by-laws can be obtained.

At the May meeting, although there were 50 members in attendance (three came in after the head count), it was not enough to satisfy the current quorom restriction, i.e., as noted in the newsletter, it takes one-half of the membership (1/2 of 134 members is a whopping big 67) to act on proposed amendments to the MSC RCC constitution and/or by-laws. Therefore, this ballot is provided to allow collection of a member's vote if he/she will not be able or does not plan to attend the June meeting to vote in person on the proposed amendments.

It is expected that this write-in procedure will be followed in the future for proposed by-law changes to insure everyone has a chance to make his or her vote count. One amendment that seems in order is to reduce the quorom definition. The following is proposed

It is proposed that Article 6 of the by-laws be changed to reflect: "A quorom is defined as one-half of the membership or 40 members whichever is less." This amendment will be discussed and voted on at the July meeting.
