Mini-product Review - I decided to put some finish trim on the "Lazy Bee" to make it look more like a "Bee". Rather than use a heating iron to attach the trim, I decided to use some "No Heat Trim Solvent" from LDM Industries. You cut the trim pieces to shape and put some trim solvent on the surface where they are attached. Then press out the surplus solvent with a "squeegee" type piece of rubber. This "sort-of" works. The trim solvent essentially dissolves a little of the surfaces of the basic film and the trim pieces. This also dissolves the color pigment, and when you "squeegee" out the solvent, you also get some color. If the trim and the basic film colors contrast -- watch out. It can get messy. But, as a bonding agent -- it works. Enough said.

Projects In Work - I ordered some covering film for the "ACE 120-BIPE" which looks like the next project. I just ordered -- I haven't seriously opened the kit box yet! (Oh - I also got an Enya 120 four-cycle just in case this plane eventually needs an engine -)

Cartoon - No one has said anything about whether there is a cartoon or not -- so, if it doesn't matter, I won't bother --!

Good luck to our guys at the NATS!!!




