JSCRCC MAY FUN FLY

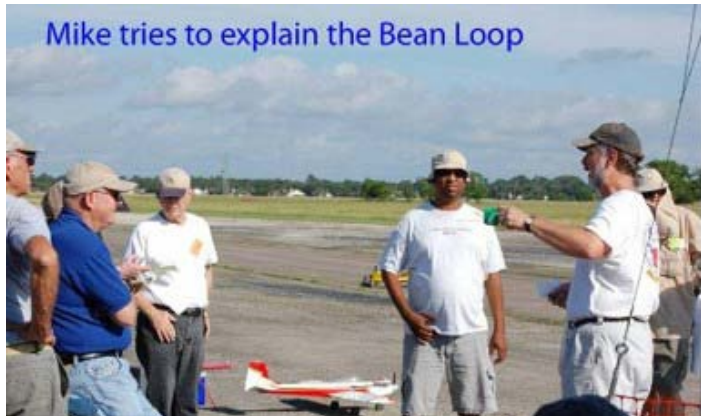

The JSCRCC Fun Fly was held on May 22, 2010. The rescheduled date apparently had little effect as the turnout was great and one of the best in several years. There were 11 "contestants" and many other helpers and visitors.

The wind conditions could have been better but after one postponement already there was little desire to reschedule.



The first event was the Bean Loop whereby 20 beans are held in a cup mounted on the forward part of the fuselage with rubber bands.



Winners were based on the number of rocks still in the cup after landing. After the first two contestants flew and landed with zero beans left it was decided "Plan B" was in order. So scientifically selected pebbles, larger, heavier and loosely referred to as "rocks", were used and now fliers were able to actually land with some rocks still in the cup.
